Collective Worship at St Anne's

At our school, Collective Worship is central to the daily life of the community and plays a vital role in the spiritual formation of pupils and staff. It is carefully planned, inclusive, and rooted in Scripture and the liturgical life of the Church.

Quality and Centrality of Worship

Collective Worship is a valued and integral part of each school day. Pupils are given regular opportunities to encounter Christ through high-quality prayer experiences, including:

- Daily classroom prayer and meditation
- Weekly assemblies and whole-school liturgies
- Sung worship every Thursday
- Liturgical celebrations and Masses during key seasons and feast days
- The Sacrament of Reconciliation, offered as part of our liturgical calendar

These worship opportunities are designed to be spiritually enriching, developmentally appropriate, and rooted in Catholic tradition, promoting reverence, joy, and active participation.

Leadership and Participation

Worship is led by a wide range of staff, modelling a shared commitment to the prayer life of the school. Each Monday Celebration of the Word is led by a different member of staff, using the **TenTen: Prayer and Liturgy – Loving Jesus** programme, which reflects Sunday's Gospel. This shared leadership approach ensures consistency, variety, and full staff engagement in spiritual formation.



In addition, our school chaplains support pupil prayer across all key stages, and pupils are increasingly taking active roles in preparing and leading worship, particularly in class-based liturgies and special services.

Pupil voice is regularly gathered to evaluate worship experiences and ensure that they are meaningful and accessible to all. Children speak positively about their experiences of prayer and reflection and understand how worship helps them grow closer to God.

Planning, Formation, and Impact

Worship is planned systematically, using high-quality Catholic resources such as Ten:Ten and diocesan materials. Planning reflects the liturgical year, with themes that are relevant to pupils' lives and responsive to the needs of the community.

Each half term, a Gospel Value (e.g. Love, Courage, Compassion, Hope, Honesty, or Forgiveness) is introduced and explored through worship and classroom reflection. Pupils' responses are shared through creative displays, which serve as visual reminders of these values throughout the term.

Staff receive support and formation to lead worship confidently and reverently. This contributes to a culture where prayer and liturgy are not isolated events, but part of the lived experience of faith across the school day.

Class and Pupil-Led Worship

At our school, we recognise Collective Worship as a vital expression of our Catholic identity and a key opportunity for pupils to grow in their personal relationship with Christ. Pupil involvement in planning and leading worship is a well-established and developing aspect of our provision and is integral to fostering a prayerful and spiritually aware community.

Pupil Leadership in Worship: Chaplaincy and Key Stage Liturgies

Our school chaplains—drawn from Key Stage 2—play an active role in planning and leading worship. Each week, they collaborate with the RE and Worship Lead to plan and deliver Key Stage Collective Worship sessions. These take place on:

- Tuesdays for EYFS and Key Stage 1
- Wednesdays for Key Stage 2

Worship is prepared using the TenTen: Prayer and Liturgy resources, ensuring alignment with the liturgical calendar and offering pupils access to Scripture-based prayer that is both engaging and age-appropriate. As part of each worship session, pupils are invited to reflect on how they can 'go forth' and live out the message of the Gospel. Their responses are thoughtfully recorded in Prayer Journals, allowing for ongoing spiritual reflection and development.

Classroom Prayer and Collective Participation

In addition to chaplain-led sessions, class teachers lead regular classroom-based worship, using the TenTen resources to provide a consistent, theologically sound structure. These prayer sessions include a range of prayer forms—spoken prayer, silence, Scripture reflection, and spontaneous prayer—encouraging children to participate in and understand the diversity of Catholic prayer life.

Pupils are given increasing opportunities to contribute to and lead aspects of classroom worship, fostering ownership of their spiritual formation and a deeper connection to their faith.

Celebration of Mass and National Events

As part of our commitment to the sacramental life of the Church, we mark all Holy Days of Obligation with the celebration of Mass at St Anne's Church, presided over by our parish priest, Fr James McCartney. Pupils from Years 1 to 6 attend, with EYFS joining later in the academic year to build familiarity and understanding.

Throughout the year, pupils also participate in worship and prayer linked to national liturgical celebrations and awareness days, including CAFOD Fast Days, Laudato Si' Week, and events aligned with Catholic Social Teaching. These opportunities enable pupils to apply their faith to contemporary issues and to see worship as a response to Gospel values in action.

RE Curriculum

Religious Education is the foundation for much of our pupil-led worship.

- Reception and Key Stage 1 follow the Source to Summit: Lighting the Path programme.
- Key Stage 2 follows the trial units from the Diocese of Salford.

Each year, pupils explore six theological themes:

- 1. Creation and Covenant
- 2. Promise and Prophecy
- 3. Galilee to Jerusalem
- 4. Desert to Garden



- 5. To the Ends of the Earth
- 6. Dialogue and Encounter

At the conclusion of each unit, classes plan and lead a worship session reflecting the key theological messages they have explored. These worship sessions provide pupils with a structured opportunity to respond to Scripture, demonstrate understanding of Catholic teaching, and express their faith through prayer, song, and symbol.



Sacred Spaces

At St Anne's Catholic Primary School, we recognise the significance of sacred spaces in fostering a prayerful atmosphere and supporting pupils in developing a personal relationship with Christ. The use of designated worship spaces throughout the school reflects our commitment to ensuring that Collective Worship is reverent, inclusive, and rooted in Catholic tradition.

Whole-School and Parish Worship

We are blessed to have a number of dedicated spaces in which pupils and staff can gather in worship.

- Our Monday Celebration of the Word and Pupil-Led Worship sessions are held in the school hall, which is treated as a sacred space during liturgical gatherings.
- Masses are celebrated at St Anne's Church, our parish church, led by Fr James McCartney, and are attended by pupils across the school throughout the liturgical year. This provides pupils with regular opportunities to participate in the sacramental life of the Church and to understand the Mass as the source and summit of Christian life.

School Chapel and Prayer Garden

In addition to communal spaces, pupils are offered regular opportunities to worship in more reflective, intimate settings:

• The School Chapel is used for class worship and small-group prayer, offering a quiet space for contemplation, Scripture, and personal reflection.



• Our Prayer Garden provides a peaceful outdoor environment for prayer and meditation, especially during liturgical seasons such as Lent and Easter. It allows children to experience God in the beauty of creation, supporting a deeper connection between faith, nature, and stewardship.

These sacred spaces serve as visible signs of our Catholic identity, and help pupils understand the importance of reverence, stillness, and intentional prayer.



Worship Tables in Every Classroom

Each classroom contains a dedicated Worship Table, acting as a focal point for prayer and liturgical learning. These tables are maintained and updated by pupils and staff to reflect the liturgical season, fostering a sense of awareness and participation in the Church's calendar.

Worship tables typically include:

- A cloth in the appropriate liturgical colour
- A Children's Catholic Bible (ESVCE)
- A candle, cross, and other prayer symbols such as rosary beads
- Prayer resources and prompts linked to the current theme or Gospel value

These spaces are not static; they evolve with the seasons and the RE curriculum, supporting the active involvement of pupils in worship preparation. Class Worship Books record liturgies planned and led by pupils—particularly those linked to the conclusion of RE units—demonstrating how Collective Worship flows naturally from the school's theological and scriptural learning.

Sung Worship and Hymns



At St Anne's Catholic Primary School, music plays a central role in our Collective Worship, enhancing the spiritual atmosphere, deepening liturgical understanding, and encouraging active participation from all pupils.

Each Thursday, the whole school gathers for a dedicated Sung Worship session, where pupils learn and practise a range of hymns and liturgical songs. These are carefully selected to reflect:

- The liturgical season (e.g. Advent, Lent, Eastertide)
- Upcoming Masses, feast days, and school liturgies

Sung worship provides pupils with the opportunity to encounter God through music, fostering a sense of joy, unity, and reverence. Through regular exposure to both traditional and contemporary hymns, children develop a repertoire that supports their full participation in Mass and school celebrations.

Hymns are chosen to support theological understanding and to reinforce the Church's teaching, helping pupils express their faith in a meaningful and engaging way. Staff model participation, and pupils are encouraged to sing with confidence, understanding that music is both a form of prayer and praise.

Daily Prayers

At St Anne's, daily prayer is a fundamental part of school life and plays a vital role in nurturing the spiritual development of every pupil. Prayer is woven into the rhythm of the school day, helping pupils to grow in faith and to recognise the presence of Christ in all they do.

Prayers are said each morning, before lunch, and at the end of the day, creating regular, age-appropriate opportunities for pupils to encounter God in moments of stillness and reflection. During these times, children stand and face the image of Jesus displayed in each classroom, a practice that fosters reverence, focus, and a shared sense of sacred space. This routine helps pupils understand that prayer is not reserved for special occasions but is a daily, living expression of faith.

These moments of prayer encourage children to:

- Begin their day by inviting God into their learning
- Pause to give thanks for the gift of food and community
- Reflect on the day's experiences and ask for God's guidance

As part of their liturgical and spiritual formation, children are taught the key traditional prayers of the Church, including:

- The Our Father
- The Hail Mary
- The Glory Be

These prayers are introduced gradually and revisited regularly so that all pupils become confident in their use and aware of their significance in the Church's liturgical life.
